Hello Charlestown Neighborhood Council,

Hope all is well. The City's Public Facilities Department (PFD) has been tapped to work with the Boston Center for Youth and Families (BCYF) in facilitating a programming and siting study for BCYF Charlestown. This is expected to be a multi-year process, facilitated by PFD, that will include community meetings to gather input from the neighborhood. This study also includes the creation of a Community Advisory Committee (CAC) that represents both BCYF and Community stakeholders. **The first of three CAC meetings is scheduled for Monday, November 16th at 6:00pm.** During this meeting, we will introduce the study and the study team and discuss the ways we will explore options for a new community center in Charlestown. These meetings will be public community meetings where anyone will be able to attend.

Your organization has been identified as a partner organization within the community that we would like to be represented on the CAC for this study. We would ask that, if interested, that you select 1 representative to take part as a CAC member during this study. CAC members will be expected to participate in community meetings and discussions during this process to represent their respective organizations, as well as the community as a whole. If you could submit your representative's information (name and contact info) to us by next Friday, November 6th, it would be very much appreciated.
